Warrant sweep nets 9 from city

ANNAPOLIS — City police, with the help of county sheriffs, picked up nine people yesterday on open warrants in and around public housing.

The effort was part of the state-sponsored Capital City Safe Streets initiative designed to fight crime in Annapolis.

Between 2 and 8 p.m., officers swarmed the streets, with a list of 30 wanted people, said Officer Hal Dalton, city Police Department spokesman.

Hicks, 44, of Dogwood Tree Road, for theft; and Joel E. Amaya, 27, of Center Street, for assault.

Officer Dalton said there are 902 unserved warrants in the city.
