

## Sheriff's deputy attacked by pit bull

**GLEN BURNIE** — A pit bull attacked an Anne Arundel County Sheriff's deputy who tried to serve an arrest warrant in Glen Burnie Sunday, deputies said.

Deputy Sheriff Jimmie Junior and other members of the Sheriff's Office Warrant Team went to 16 Harvard Road to serve an arrest warrant to Jennifer Ludwig.

Ms. Ludwig's father told the deputies she no longer lived there and gave them permission to search the house. The deputies searched the first floor, where several dogs were locked in a room, deputies said.

Deputy Junior went to the second floor and opened a bedroom door when a large pit bull jumped out. The dog began to attack and bite Deputy Junior on the right arm, stomach and upper left leg, deputies said. The dog's owner was able to take control of the dog and lock it in the bedroom.

The search was completed and deputies were unable to find Ms. Ludwig at the home. Deputy Junior was taken to Anne Arundel Medical Center where he was treated for his bite wounds, deputies said. Animal Control was notified about the incident.
